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LESSON 2.1: ALLAH:

There is only one God and His name is ALLAH.

Who is Allah? He is the One:

- Who made us all and everything around us.
- Who looks after us
- Whom we ask for help.
- Whom we listen to.
- Whom we will go back.

Because Allah has done so much for us and given us so much we should remember Him before we start anything - by saying:

بِسْمِ اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ

I begin in the name of Allah, the most Kind and the most Merciful.

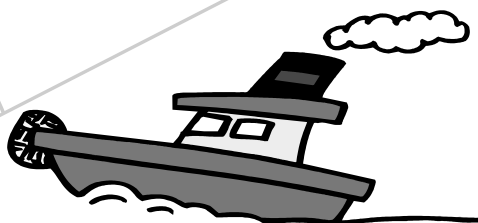
When we say بِسْمِ اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ, Allah helps us and it keeps Shaitan away from us so he cannot come and try to spoil what we are doing.

A story about بِسْمِ اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ

A long time ago, there lived a man who always came late to school.

One day, his teacher, Syed Murtadha, asked him why he was always late.

He replied that it was because he had to catch a boat to cross the river to get to school, and the boat was always late.



His teacher told him that he was giving him a piece of paper with something special written on it and with this paper in his hand the man would be able to walk on the water, but he must not look at what was written on the paper.

The next day the man went to the river and with the paper in his hand he stepped onto the water and began to walk on the water. The man reached his school in time.

Every morning the man walked on the water and reached his school on time, until one day when he looked at what his teacher had written on the paper.

It said:

بِسْمِ اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ

The man thought to himself: **"is that all it says"**. He then took the paper and went to walk on the water but this time he began to sink. He tried and tried but could no longer walk on the water.

That day he arrived to school late because he again had to wait for the boat to take him across the river.

When his teacher saw that he was late again he said to him that because he had thought what was written on the paper was not very important, he could no longer walk on water.

بِسْمِ اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ

is very powerful if you truly believe in it.

LESSON 2.2: I CAN'T SEE ALLAH:

Our Holy Prophet Muhammad (s.a.w.) has told us that:

When you see the footprints of a camel in the sand, then you know that a camel has passed by; even though you cannot see the camel itself.

In the same way, when you see all the creations of Allah; you know He is there, even though you cannot see Him.

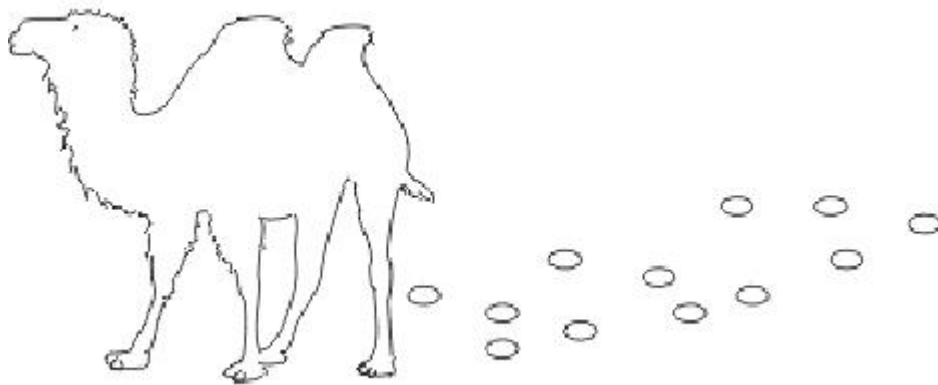
WORKSHEET 2.2: I CAN'T SEE ALLAH:

Allah made everything and has power over everything and everyone.

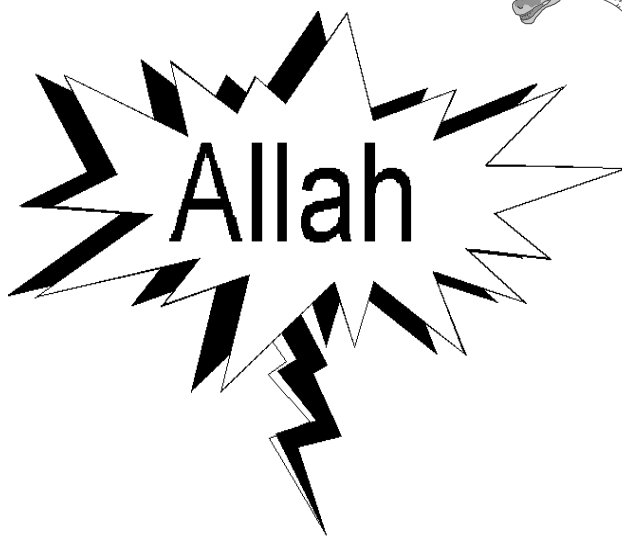
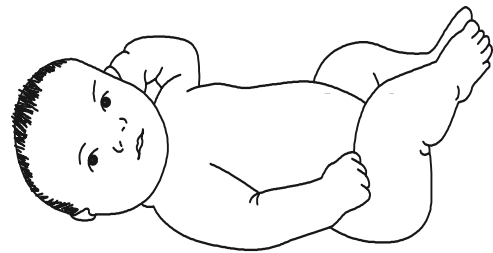
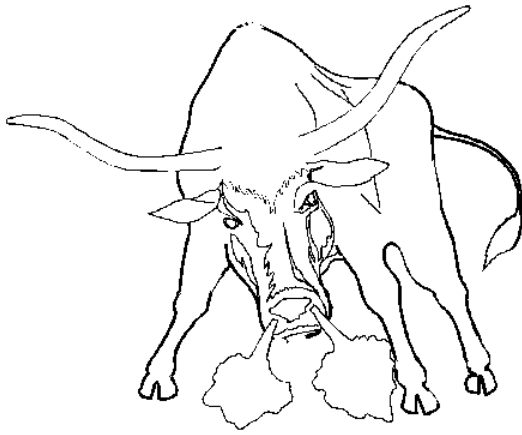
There is no one; and nothing stronger than Him; He is the strongest.

LESSON 2.6: ALLAH DOES WHAT HE WANTS:

He knows when you are good and when you are bad.


He knows if you are telling the truth and when you are lying.

A perfect example of Allah making a non-living thing speak is:

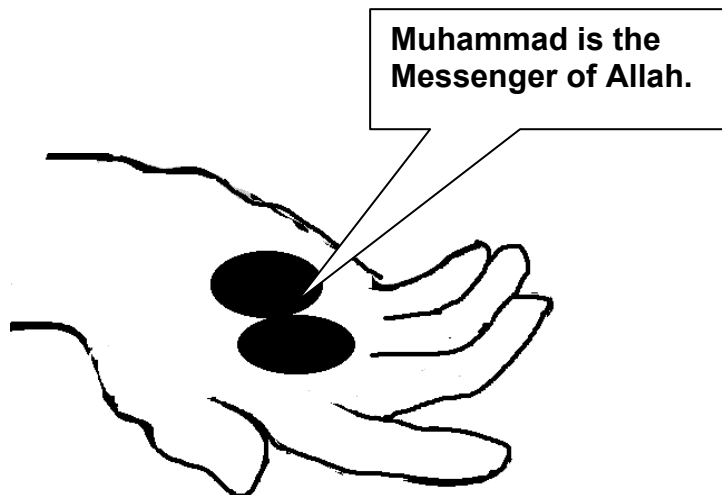
The Story about, Prophet Muhammad (s.a.w.); and the pebbles:

He made everything and He is the strongest.

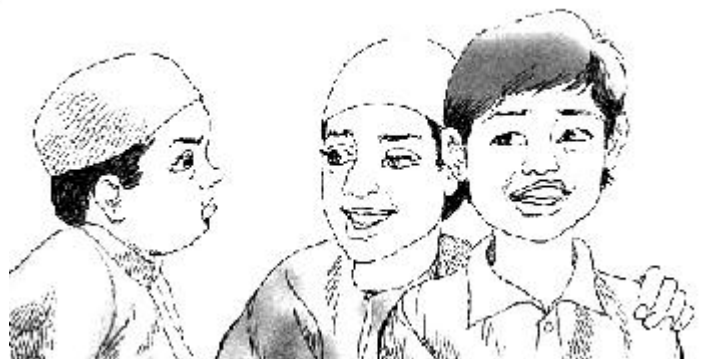
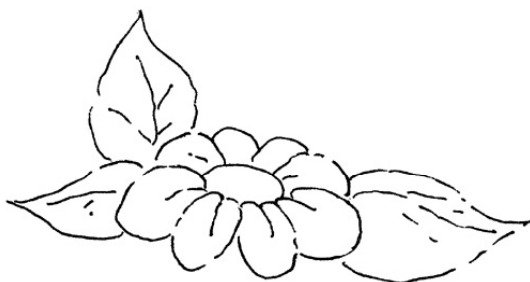
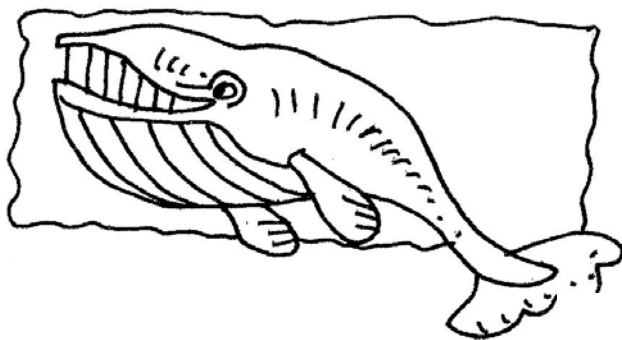
Allah can make anything talk.

LESSON 2.9: WUDHU-EXPLANATION:

Wudhu was taught, by our Holy Prophet, Prophet Muhammad (s.a.w.), after he came back from Me'raj.

In Me'raj the Holy Prophet (s.a.w.) did Wudhu with the water from the river in Heaven.

Wudhu is the special way to wash yourself before you pray.

Wudhu is not only needed for Salaat but also for:

- Tawaf around the Kaa'ba
- Touching the writing of the Holy Qur'an
- Touching the names of Allah and the 14 Ma'sumeen

It is very good to do Wudhu:

- before you go to sleep
- before you go to the Imambara
- when you are angry (as it calms you down)
- In fact anytime at all.

Before doing Wudhu you should make sure that:

- the parts of Wudhu (face, arms, head, feet) are all Pak, **AND**
- there is nothing on them which would stop the water reaching it
E.g. Plaster, nail varnish, rings, etc

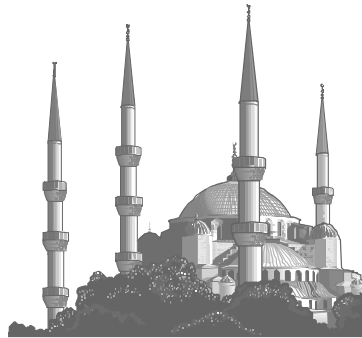

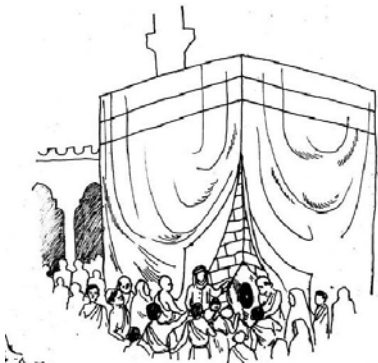

Those actions that are Wajib, have to be done.

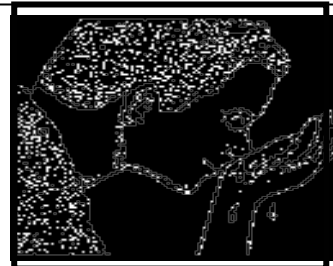

times.**

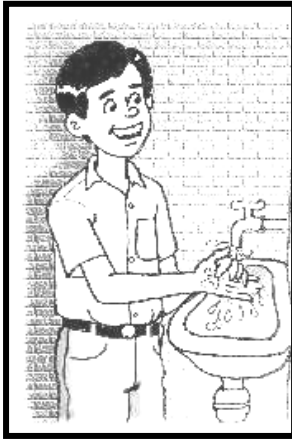

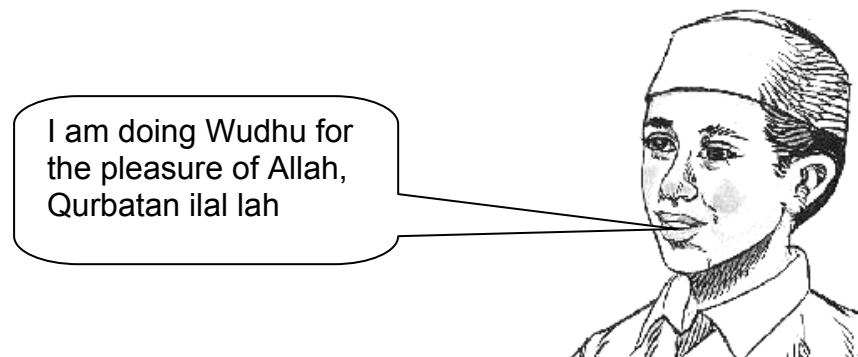

5th action of Wudhu: **Masah of the feet:**

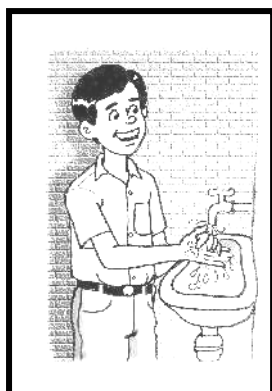

LESSON 2.15: TASBEEH:

The Tasbeeh that we recite after our Salaat is known as the Tasbeeh of Bibi Fatima az-Zahra (a.s.), because, her father, our Holy Prophet (s.a.w.) gave it to her as a present.

Bibi Fatima (A) used to work very hard in her house.

Her father saw how hard she worked.

So one day he told her that he was going to give her something that would be better than anything else in the world.

He gave her '**Tasbeeh**'.

He told her that after every Salaat she should say:

اَللّٰهُ اَكْبَرُ = Allah is the Greatest : **34 times**

اَلْحَمْدُ لِلّٰهِ = All praise is to Allah: **33 times**

سُبْحَانَ اللّٰهِ = Glory to Allah: **33 times**

The Salaat is like a beautiful flower and the Tasbeeh of Bibi Fatima az-Zahra (a.s.) gives that beautiful flower a beautiful smell.

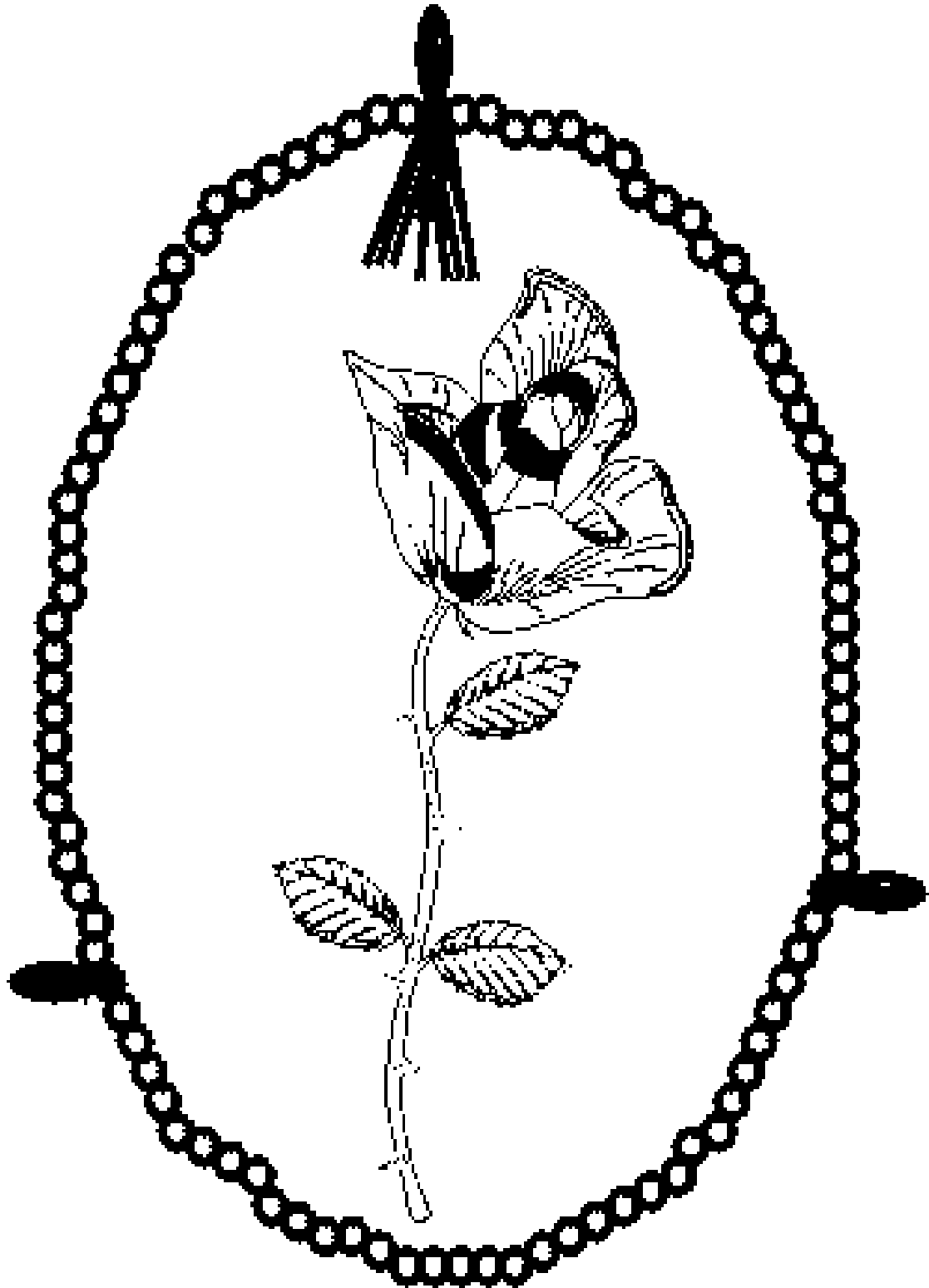
So after every Salaat we should recite the Tasbeeh of Bibi Fatima (a.s.) because we want our Salaat to be like a beautiful flower with a beautiful smell.
